DECREES

Art.1

Establishment of the XL cycle

The Department of Human Sciences of the European University of Rome has established the innovative and interdisciplinary Doctorate of Research Course in "The Person, Well-being and Innovation" - XL cycle.

The Doctoral course is divided into five curricula, combining specific skills with an interdisciplinary approach aimed at promoting well-being, health and innovation in different organizational and social contexts.









Pursuant to MUR Decree No. 226 of 14 December 2021, the doctoral course will commence solely upon receipt of a positive opinion from the National Agency for the Evaluation of Universities and Research Institutes (ANVUR) upon fulfillment of the requirements for ministerial accreditation. Thus, the places on offer and the scholarships will be awarded only in the event of a positive outcome of such an evaluation.

Art.2

Selections

A public competition has been announced for the admission to the PhD Course referred to in art. 1. There are 8 places available as follows:

- a) n.5 places of which 3 scholarships fully funded by the University and 2 without scholarship;
- b) n.1 place with scholarship fully funded by the University reserved for candidates from abroad¹;
- c) n.2 places with scholarship funded under Ministerial Decree 630 of 24 April 2024 on the specific and binding topic specified-in Annex 1 to this call²;

Art.3

Admission requirements

The application for participation can be submitted by Italian or foreign citizens who are in possession of a master's degree³ or a suitable qualification obtained abroad, that has been officially recognized as equivalent. The candidate who holds an academic qualification awarded abroad, that has not yet been recognized as equivalent, must accompany his or her application with whatever documents are necessary to enable the Admissions Commission – consistent with the rules in force in Italy and the country where the qualification was granted and the international treaties or agreements governing the recognition of qualifications for further education purposes – to assess the qualification solely for doctoral program eligibility purposes. The qualifications must therefore be accompanied by all the documentation specified in article 4 that is necessary for their assessment.

¹ The place is reserved for candidates who meet all the following requirements: 1) not in possession of Italian citizenship; 2) not in possession of a residency or domicile in Italy or not having carried out his/her main occupation in Italy for more than 6 months, even non-consecutive, in the last 3 years from the date of the deadline of the call; 3) having been accepted onto a Doctoral Research program held by a foreign University.

² The eligibility in question will be attributed on condition of the successful conclusion of the agreement with the co-financing company.

³ The equivalence of the Degrees prior to Ministerial Decree no. 509 of 3 November 1999 to the Master's Degree classes must be self-certified by the candidate pursuant to Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28 December 2000, as amended by art. 15 paragraph 1 of Law no. 183 of 12 November 2011. The equivalence must be requested by the candidate at the University that issued the title, pursuant to the Ministerial Decree of 9 July 2009.









In the case that a candidate applies while awaiting graduation, his/her application will be considered "pending" and the candidate will have to submit certification (alternatively, for EU citizens only, self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, no. 445) of the degree title containing the exams taken with the corresponding grades and credits, the average grade of the exams, and the final degree grade by no later than the enrollment date for the PhD course as established in Article 8 of this announcement (October 21, 2024), under penalty of forfeiture of admission to the course in case of a positive selection outcome. If the candidate fails the procedure, he/she will be excluded.

Applications may only be accepted from individuals who have been awarded the qualification by and no later than 21 October 2024.

In the case of admission, candidates holding a degree obtained abroad (EU/Non-EU countries) are required to submit the following documentation to the Research Office (ricerca@unier.it) no later than the enrollment date for the PhD course as established in Article 8 of this announcement (October 21, 2024), under penalty of forfeiture of admission to the PhD course:

- Certification (alternatively, for EU citizens only, self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, no. 445) of the official foreign degree, and the corresponding final grade, equivalent to the second cycle according to the framework of qualifications of the Bologna Process and level 7 according to the European Qualifications Framework (EQF) obtained at a higher education institution that allows the continuation of studies at the next level (third cycle of the Bologna Process/level 8 EQF), and that does not present any "substantial difference" according to the principles of the Lisbon Convention and the national methodology adopted by the Italian ENIC-NARIC center (CIMEA)⁴. If the document is not already in English, it will be mandatory to attach a sworn translation into English or Italian.
- Certification/self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, no. 445 attesting to the exams taken (transcript). If the document is not already in English, it will be mandatory to attach a sworn translation into English or Italian;
- Diploma supplement or statement of comparability issued by CIMEA or other ENIC-NARIC centers, and any other documentation useful for evaluating the eligibility of the degree for the chosen course; alternatively, a declaration of value in loco is accepted.

It is also specified that all candidates who submit self-certifications of their degree title, pursuant to DPR no. 445 of 2000, will be admitted to the selection conditionally upon verification of the self-certified declarations and that the University may, at any time during the procedure, even after the start of the PhD course, carry out checks on the truthfulness of the submitted declarations.

In the case of false declarations, the University may order, by a reasoned decision of the Rector, the exclusion of candidates from the selection procedure or the PhD course, without prejudice to the criminal responsibilities arising from this.

Art. 4

Application to the selection

The application for admission to the selection process, including the mandatory documentation, must be completed and submitted, under penalty of exclusion, by July 26, 2024 at 12:00 PM (Italian time), using exclusively the online procedure available at: https://pica.cineca.it/unier/phd40/domande/

Information for completing the application is available at the following link: https://www.universitaeuropeadiroma.it/ricerca/dottorato-di-ricerca/persona-benessere-e-innovazione-xl-ciclo/

It is possible to access the application completion and submission procedure via SPID, or using credentials the candidate already possesses, or by creating a new registration.

The application is completed by entering the required information and attaching the indicated documents.

Files must be uploaded in .pdf format and must be named with a progressive number, the candidate's surname and first name, and the file name, for example: 1_surname_firstname_curriculum.pdf. In case of multiple files of the same type, add a progressive number at the end (1 surname firstname curriculum 2.pdf).

Each file can have a maximum size of 30 MB.

Once the application completion and submission procedure is finished, the candidate will receive an email confirming the delivery, an identification code necessary for any communication with CINECA and the Research Office, and a protocol number to be kept as it will be used as an identifier in the ranking published on the University website.

It is the candidate's responsibility to verify the correct completion of the procedure. No complaints will be accepted for any malfunctions of the computer system due to overloads near the deadline.

Under no circumstances will additions to the documentation be accepted after the deadline of the call.

Applications that have not been submitted according to the methods indicated in this article are invalid for participation in the competition and will therefore be automatically excluded.

It is possible to submit the application for several types of eligibility in order of preference, filling in a single application form and submitting a single research project. It is not possible to apply for two eligibilities funded by the University (art. 2. par.2 lett. a and b).

The application shall be considered for all legal purposes as a self-certification, pursuant to Articles 46 and 47 of DPR 445/2000 and subsequent amendments, of the data contained therein and in the documents attached to it, and the candidates must make the following substitute declarations:

• surname (original family name for married women), the name, date and place of birth, residence, citizenship and tax code;









- exact name of the qualification held, with the indication of the date of achievement, the average of the marks reported during the exams provided by the university, the final grade, the duration of the course of study, the University that issued it (or the equivalent title obtained at a foreign university), as well as the date of the decree by which the equivalence itself was declared. If the qualification has not already been declared equivalent to one of the required Italian qualifications, admission to the competition is subject to the commission's recognition of the qualification, for the sole purpose of admission to the selection. Candidates not yet in possession of the qualification will be admitted with "reservation" and will be required to obtain the qualification within the deadline provided for in Article 8 of this announcement for enrolment in the doctoral course, under penalty of forfeiture of admission in case of a positive outcome of the selection;
- to attend the Doctoral Course full-time according to the procedures that will be established by the Board of Professors;
- to be aware that simultaneous enrollment in several courses of study that lead to the achievement of a qualification is permitted in the cases expressly provided for by law no. 33 of 12 April 2022;
- to have a good knowledge of the English language;
- to have a good knowledge of the Italian language (for EU and foreign citizens);
- to be/or not an employee of the Public Administration;
- to have/or not have previously benefited from another scholarship (even for a single year) for a PhD program, advanced, or specialization course
 - to be aware that anyone who has received a scholarship for a PhD program, advanced, or specialization course cannot request to receive it a second time, even if for a different title;
 - o to be aware that it is not possible to award PNRR PhD scholarship to candidates who have renounced the aforementioned scholarship from the 38th cycle and the 39th cycle, in accordance with Ministerial Decree no. 630/24.
- to have read the notice of the application requirements for this research position;
- the address elected for the purposes of the competition specifying the postal code, the telephone number and the e-mail address with express mention of the commitment to promptly communicate any change to the same.

With regard to EU and foreign citizens, indicate an Italian address or the indication of your Embassy in Italy, elected as domicile.

Candidates applying for eligibility pursuant to Article 2, paragraph 2, letter c), must also declare:

• to be aware that the renunciation of the scholarship financed by Ministerial Decree 630/24 involves renouncing the entire PhD course.

Candidates recognized as differently abled under Law no. 104 of February 5, 1992, may request assistance to take the competition tests.

To the application, the candidate must attach, under penalty of exclusion, the following documentation:

• photocopy of a valid identification document signed by the candidate;









- photocopy of the tax code (only for Italian citizens and foreigners who are in possession of it) signed by the candidate;
- curriculum vitae;
- For foreign candidates, valid residence permit or copy of the request to the competent authorities (if in possession);
- any publications; only publications produced in full will be evaluated. Texts or articles accepted for publication, by the call deadline, must be submitted together with the publisher's acceptance document. Publications must be produced in .pdf in a copy declared to be true to the original by means of a declaration in lieu of certification or affidavit in accordance with Articles 46 and 47 of Presidential Decree No. 445/2000. Publications in a foreign language other than English must be accompanied by a translation into Italian or English; the translation must be certified as conforming to the foreign text by the competent consular or diplomatic representation, or by an official translator, or it may be accompanied by a declaration in lieu of affidavit pursuant to art. 47 of Presidential Decree 445/2000 of conformity to the original language document signed by the candidate and accompanied by a copy of a valid identity document.
- the research project.

As for academic qualifications, applicants must submit appropriate documentation proving possession of a master's degree or similar academic qualification obtained abroad. It is therefore specified that:

Candidates with a qualification awarded in ITALY are obliged to submit the following mandatory documents:

- Certification/self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, n. 445 of the degree title containing the exams taken with the respective grades and credits, the average grade of the exams, and the final degree grade (for each degree, if more than one degree is held).

Candidates who must obtain their degree in ITALY are oblige to submit the following mandatory documents:

 Certification/self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, no. 445 of the degree to be obtained and the exams taken with the respective grades and credits, and weighted average of the exam grades.

Candidates holding a degree obtained in EU/NON-EU COUNTRIES, whose degree has already been recognized as equivalent by an Italian university are obliged to submit the following mandatory documents:

- Decree of equivalence;
- Certification (alternatively, for EU citizens only, self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, no. 445) of the degree title containing the exams taken with the respective grades (with the grading scale used in the country where the degree was issued, useful for the Commission to assign the relevant score) and credits, the average grade of the exams, and the final degree grade. If the document is not already in English, it will be mandatory to also attach a sworn translation in English or Italian









Candidates holding a degree obtained in EU/NON-EU COUNTRIES, which has not been recognized as equivalent and for which equivalence is requested from the Examination Committee are obliged to submit the following mandatory documents:

- Certification (alternatively, for EU citizens only, self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, no. 445) of the official foreign qualification, and the respective final grade (with the grading scale used in the country where the qualification was issued, useful for the Commission to assign the relevant score), corresponding to the second cycle according to the Bologna Process framework and level 7 according to the European Qualifications Framework (EQF), obtained from a higher education institution that allows for further studies at academic institutions at the next level (third cycle of the Bologna Process/level 8 EQF), and that presents no "substantial differences" according to the principles of the Lisbon Convention and the national methodology adopted by the Italian ENIC-NARIC center (CIMEA)⁵. If the document is not already in English, it will be mandatory to also attach a sworn translation in English or Italian;
- Certification (alternatively, for EU citizens only, self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, no. 445) attesting to the exams passed (transcript). If the document is not already in English, it will be mandatory to also attach a sworn translation in English or Italian;
- Diploma supplement or certificate of comparability issued by CIMEA or other ENIC-NARIC centers, and any other documentation useful for assessing the eligibility of the qualification for the chosen course; alternatively, a declaration of value in loco is accepted (the documents listed here are not mandatory at the application stage).

Candidates who must obtain their degree in EU/NON-EU COUNTRIES are obliged to submit the following mandatory documents:

- Certification (alternatively, for EU citizens only, self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, no. 445) of the degree to be obtained and the exams taken with the respective grades and the weighted average of the exams (with the grading scale used in the country where the degree is issued, useful for the Commission to assign the relevant score). If the document is not already in English, it will be mandatory to also attach a sworn translation in English or Italian;
- Certification (alternatively, for EU citizens only, self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 28 December 2000, no. 445) of enrollment in the second-cycle university program. If the document is not already in English, it will be mandatory to also attach a sworn translation in English or Italian.

If the documentation produced does not clearly indicate the length of the academic study cycle and/or the eligibility of the foreign degree for admission to the doctoral program in the country of reference or the value scale to which the degree and exam scores refer, the Selection Committee may deny admission to the tests or not evaluate the degree or exam scores.

Candidates with foreign degrees are admitted to the competition with reservation. This can be lifted only when, if the candidates are successful, they produce the obligatory diploma supplement or certificate of comparability from CIMEA or other ENIC-NARIC centers, as stipulated in Article 8.

Alternatively, the declaration of equivalence of qualification is accepted.

Candidates with disabilities and candidates diagnosed with specific learning disabilities (SLD), pursuant to Law No. 104/1992 and Law No. 170/2010, may submit an explicit request, based on their difficulties, for aids and/or any additional time necessary for the completion of the interview, attaching the relevant certifications, by the application deadline specified in the announcement.

Candidates with disabilities include: blind candidates, i.e. with absolute blindness or with a vision capacity not exceeding 1/10 in both eyes; deaf candidates, i.e. those affected by deafness at birth or before learning the spoken language; candidates with a percentage of civil disability equal to or greater than 66%, candidates in possession of the certification of disability provided for by Law 104/1992. These states must result from a specific medical certificate issued by the competent Authorities.

Candidates with specific learning disabilities are candidates diagnosed with: dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dysorthography. These states must be confirmed by a specific clinical certification issued no more than three years ago by the National Health Service or by private services.

The University reserves the right to carry out due checks on the documentation submitted by the candidates. Candidates who have made false declarations will be excluded from the procedure and the course, with the obligation to return the scholarship installments unduly received, without prejudice to the criminal penalties provided for by law.

Art 5.

Selection Procedure

The selection procedure is aimed at ascertaining the candidate's preparation, his aptitude for scientific research, and good knowledge of the English language, in addition to Italian for foreign citizens only.

The admission test to the course consists of the evaluation of the university curriculum, titles, and any publications, as well as the research project presented by the candidate (max 30 points) and an interview (max 30 points).

The research project, written in Italian or English and attached to the application form, under penalty of exclusion, must concern one of the topics in Annex 1 to this call.

Candidates who apply for the scholarship reserved for those who hold a foreign degree will have to submit a research project written in English.

The project must bear, in no more than 6,000 characters, spaces included, excluding bibliographic references:

- a. title;
- b. object of study;
- c. current state of research (national and international);
- d. purpose of the research;
- e. methodology;
- f. main bibliographic references.









The research project will be evaluated by the Commission according to the following criteria:

- relevance and coherence with the chosen topic: the project deals with a topic of considerable relevance and/or importance and is consistent with the chosen topic;
- <u>novelty</u>: the project addresses a theme on which there is still no complete doctrinal analysis and/or proposes a perspective of innovative analysis;
- <u>comparative/international dimension</u>: the project aims at examining the legal systems of other states and/or at examining the chosen topic within the perspective of an international and/or European order:
- <u>interdisciplinarity</u>: the project presents an interdisciplinary profile with respect to one or more PhD subjects;
- structure: the project is well articulated, follows a logical argument and is well written.

It will therefore be examined, in compliance with the provisions of the announcement, the documentation presented by the candidate and, specifically, the data relating to the university training course, any further training courses and research experiences, and publications (if applicable). It is recommended that candidates include their publications, if any, to the application, as indicated in the art.4, together with a list of the included publications. Publications will be evaluated by the Commission, taking into account their scientific originality, methodological rigour, relevance to the topics studied in the doctorate, and the ranking of the journals and/or publications.

Candidates who get a score of less than 20/30 in the evaluation of the university curriculum, titles, publications, and the research project are not admitted to the oral exam.

The results of the evaluation of the university curriculum, the titles, any publications, and the research project are published on public in the University website before the date of the oral exam.

The oral exam may be held online, by using the link to a digital platform (e.g., MS Teams, Zoom, etc) provided by the University. Candidates admitted to the interview may avail themselves of this possibility by sending an e-mail request to ricerca@unier.it at least 7 days before the date of the oral test.

Candidates must be available at the personal address, communicated in the request, on the day and time indicated for the oral test.

For identification purposes and under penalty of exclusion from the competition, candidates, before the interview begins, must identify themselves by showing an identity document, preferably the same one that was indicated during admission.

The European University of Rome accepts no responsibility if technical reasons prevent the smooth running of the oral test.

The interview is mainly focused on the research project presented by the candidate and on topics related to the subjects covered by the doctorate program. During the interview, the Commission evaluates the level of in-depth knowledge of the candidate on the research project topic and literature, as well as his/her ability to carry out argued reasoning and to establish relationships with concepts typical of the scientific-disciplinary sector to which the research project refers.









In the case of submission of more than one research project, the candidate will have to undertake further interviews on the research projects submitted.

The candidate must also demonstrate a good knowledge of the English language. The assessment of the English language will cover both reading, speaking and translating skills.

EU and foreign candidates must also demonstrate a good knowledge of the Italian language.

Candidates who obtain a score of 20/30 or higher in the oral exam are deemed to be suitable.

The university curriculum and qualifications are evaluated in the following ways:

- a) Graduation mark or weighted average of the exams' grade taken for candidates admitted with reserve, up to 7 points
- Graduation mark:

from 27.27 to 27.80 2 points

from 26.45 to 27.26 1 point

- b) Master's degree or equivalent course from 0 to 1 point
- c) publications in accordance with and according to the criteria of art. 3, D.M. 28 July 2009, n. 89, from 0 to 2 points.









d) research project 20 points

The indication of the date and time of the oral exam will be made public at least 15 days in advance by publication on the website of the University https://www.universitaeuropeadiroma.it/ricerca/, "Dottorato di Ricerca", Dottorato in "Persona, benessere e innovazione – XL ciclo". This publication shall equate to full notification.

Art. 6

Selection Committee

The Selection Board for the admission to the PhD Course is appointed by the Rector on the proposal of the Board of Professors of the Doctorate. The Board is composed of a minimum of 3 to a maximum of 5 members, including the president, to which can be added no more than two experts, including non-Italian nationals, chosen from public and private research entities. The appointment of experts is mandatory in the case of agreements or arrangements with small and medium-sized enterprises. For the sole purpose of supporting the Committee in the evaluation of specific disciplines, consultants may be appointed, who participate in the meetings of the commission without the right to vote.

Once the competition tests have been completed, in consideration of the types of eligibility specified in the call for applications, the Board compiles separate merit rankings on the basis of the sum of the grades achieved by each candidate in the individual tests and in the evaluation of the university curriculum, qualifications, publications (if any), and research project.

Art. 7

Ranking of merit

The candidates will be ranked according to merit in the descending order of the overall score achieved and approved by Rectoral Decree.

The scholarship are awarded to the doctoral students according to the order defined in the merit rankings prepared by the Board in accordance with the selection procedure.

Regarding the type of eligibility reserved for candidates from foreign countries (art. 2, paragraph 2, letter b), the Commission, in the event of one of the following situations:

- a) lack of applications for that type of eligibility;
- b) lack of eligible candidates in the ranking drawn up for that type of eligibility;
- c) withdrawal by the candidates included in the relevant ranking,

will award the scholarship to the first candidate admitted without a scholarship in the ranking for the type of eligibility referred to in art. 2, paragraph 2, letter a).

In the event of a tie, the following shall prevail: a) the candidate who has obtained the highest grade in the required degree; b) if the same grade in the required degree has been achieved, the candidate









who has obtained the highest average grade in the exams (weighted in the case of qualifications ex DD.MM. 509/99 or 270/2004); c) if there is parity among candidates in both points a) and b) the youngest candidate will be awarded the scholarship.

According to the conditions laid out in the call, candidates who have been admitted to the Course on the basis of their rankings will forfeit their scholarship if they fail to communicate their acceptance. In such a case, another candidate will be appointed according to the order of the respective ranking. The same applies if any of the successful candidates renounces within four months from the beginning of the Course. If the renouncer has already benefited from monthly scholarships, he is obliged to return them.

Art. 8

Enrollment of winners

The Rector's Decree approving the ranking of the PhD competition, issued within 15 days of the conclusion of the evaluation procedure, will be announced on the Website of the University https://www.universitaeuropeadiroma.it/ricerca/, Dottorato di ricerca, Dottorato in "Persona, benessere e innovazione" – XL ciclo.

The winners, under penalty of forfeiture of the right of enrollment, must comply with the following, no later than October 21, 2024:

- register on the site www.universitaeuropeadiroma.it in the "ESSE3" section. Registration allows the creation of credentials (Username and Password).
- fill in the application form online by accessing the University's computer system with the above credentials.

The regional tax must be paid directly to the DiscoLazio Regional Authority, as indicated in "Regulation of fees and contributions a.y. 2024/25" of the University.

• winners without scholarship only: should pay registration fee (€ 330.00 registration fee + virtual stamp duty € 16.00) by MAV ON-LINE (Payment by Notice), by 21 October 2024. This is downloadable by accessing the University's computer system, with the above credentials. Candidates who have been awarded a scholarship are required to pay the virtual stamp duty (€ 16.00).

The following categories are required to pay only the virtual stamp duty (\in 16.00):

- persons with disabilities, with recognition of disability pursuant to Article 3 of Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992, or with an invalidity equal to or greater than 66% (ART. 9 DL 68/2012);
- persons who are recognized as refugees, pursuant to the Geneva Convention of 28/07/51, ratified by Law no. 722 of 24 July 1954, upon presentation of the document certifying the position;
- international students receiving scholarships from the Italian Government;
- the winners of scholarships provided by DiscoLazio and those eligible for the awarding of DiscoLazio scholarships who have not been beneficiaries of these funds, due to lack of









Regional resources.

During the registration procedure on the Esse3 system, the attached documents must be uploaded exclusively in .pdf format (each attachment must not exceed 5 MB - submissions in .jpeg format are not allowed)

For Italian and foreign citizens:

- a passport-size photograph;
- copy of the tax code (front/back) (only for Italian citizens and foreigners who are in possession of it);
- self-certification of the university degree with dates and grades of the exams;
- candidates with a foreign qualification admitted to the course, if they have not handed it in at the admission stage, must submit or send to ricerca@unier.it, by October 21, 2024, under penalty of suspension of course admission and subsequent forfeiture, the diploma supplement in English, issued by the same institution that issued the qualification, drawn up according to the European model or the certificate of comparability of the ENIC-NARIC centers. Alternatively, the declaration of the declaration of equivalence of qualification of the degree, issued by the Italian Diplomatic Representation of the country to whose system the degree refers, can be presented;

For the winners with scholarship only:

• Statement in lieu of a notarized document pursuant to Articles. 46 and 47 of the aforementioned Presidential Decree 445/2000 which specifies that the candidate's gross annual personal income does not exceed the amount of the scholarship and the commitment to promptly communicate any exceeding of the income limit.

For non-EU citizens only:

• valid residence permit or copy of the request to the competent authorities.

Those candidates who have been successfully classified in the ranking compiled by the Commission and who do not fulfill the above stipulated criteria will be considered as waiverers. The vacancies will be made available to candidates who subsequently ranked in the merit ranking, who must complete the registration, under penalty of exclusion, within six days following receipt of the communication from the University, by sending the required documentation following the procedure indicated above.

The second installment of € 330.00 must be paid by April 15, 2025.

If the PhD student does not pay the second installment within the scheduled deadline, a penalty of € 50.00 will be applied.

Enrollment in the following years is subject to the favourable opinion of the Board of Professors of the Doctorate and the meeting of all administrative requirements.

The deadlines for the payment of registration fees for subsequent years will be established in the University Fees and Contributions Regulations.









Art. 9

Scholarships

Scholarships, equal to 16,243.00 gross of social security charges borne by the beneficiary, as established by Ministerial Decree 247 of 23 February 2022, are awarded, after comparative evaluation of the merit and according to the order defined in the respective merit rankings formulated by the selection board.

The number of scholarships may be increased as a result of additional funding from public and private entities, provided that the relative agreements are stipulated on a date prior to the completion of the admission procedure.

The increase in the number of scholarships may increase the number of positions available, based on the University Governing Bodies' decision, taken before the completion of the tests. Any increase in the number of scholarships and positions available will be announced exclusively on the University's website.

The scholarships have an annual duration and are renewed on condition that the PhD student has completed the program of activities planned for the previous year, according to the procedures established by the Board of Professors of the PhD, without prejudice to the obligation to provide the scholarship following a favorable verification.

In order to avail of the scholarship, the successful candidate's total annual personal income cannot exceed the annual amount of the scholarship. Income of a financial nature and any other amount of a recurring nature, except for those of an occasional nature, contribute to the determination of gross income.

The monetary amount of the scholarship is increased by a maximum of 50% for a total period not exceeding 12 months, if the PhD student is authorized by the Board of Professors to carry out research in a foreign country.

PhD students with a scholarship reserved for citizens of foreign countries, may be authorized by the Board of Professors to spend periods of research only in countries different from their country of origin.

PhD students with PNRR scholarships, financed under D.M. No. 630/24, pursuant to Art. 7, para. 1, lett. c. and d., will have the obligation to spend a period of study and research in the enterprise of a minimum of six (6) to a maximum of eighteen (18) months, including non-consecutive, over the three-year period; they will be required to spend a period of study and research abroad, of six (6) months, including non-consecutive time periods, over the three-year period.

Each PhD student is assured, in addition to the scholarship and within the financial resources existing in the budget of the subjects accredited by current legislation, of a budget for research in Italy and abroad appropriate to the type of course and for an amount not less than 10% of the amount of the









scholarship.

Students in receipt of a scholarship for a PhD program, advanced, or specialization course, even for a single year, cannot apply for a second time.

It is not possible to award PNRR PhD scholarships to candidates who have renounced the aforementioned scholarships from the 38th cycle and the 39th cycle, in accordance with Ministerial Decree No. 630/2024.

At the moment of enrollment, students who are entitled to the scholarship must submit a declaration specifying their total gross personal income and the absence of any impediment or incompatibility as indicated in this paragraph. The declaration must be repeated at the beginning of each year of course attendance.

The beneficiaries of the scholarships are subject to registration for INPS welfare contributions to the state scheme for atypical workers in accordance with the regulations in force.

Students who are entitled to scholarship referred to in art. 2, paragraph 2, letters a) and b) may choose to waive it, even at the time of admission, nonetheless, they maintain the possibility of attending the doctoral course. In case of waiver of the scholarship, the PhD student is required to pay all the fees related to the current year.

If the holder of a doctoral scholarship, withdraws from the Course, he/she forfeits all further monthly payments, however, he/she retains the right to the payment of the last month commensurate with performance during that period.

If the doctoral student has received scholarship installments referring to a period after his/her withdrawal, he/she is required to repay the amount received.

The withdrawn doctoral student is required, in any case, to notify the Rector one month before the withdrawal. If the renunciation occurs within the first year, the remaining part of the scholarship can be attributed to another student who is without a scholarship, according to the order of the ranking of the admission.

All funded positions referred to in art. 2, paragraph 2, letter c) are to be considered exclusively as positions with a scholarship. Therefore, winners cannot decline the doctoral scholarship (either in full or partially) and continue their doctoral program without the scholarship. Declining the scholarship referred to in art. 2, paragraph 2, letter c) will result in forfeiture of the doctoral position for which they were selected. Consequently, the candidate cannot continue their program if they encounter situations of incompatibility that require them to decline, even partially, the doctoral scholarship (e.g., simultaneous enrollment in medical specialization schools, etc.).

Art. 10

Obligations of PhD students

Admission to the Doctoral Course usually involves an exclusive and full-time commitment. Doctoral students are obliged to attend the courses and activities of the Doctoral Program to the extent that will be determined by the Board of Professors and to carry out continuous study and research activities









within the facilities designated for this purpose in the manner that will be determined by the Board of Professors.

Doctoral students may carry out, as an integral part of the educational project, with the prior authorization of the Board of Professors and without increasing the amount of the scholarship, tutoring activities, including paid tutoring, of students in bachelor's and master's degree programs, as well as, within the limit of forty hours per academic year, supplementary teaching activities.

PhD students are required to engage in Third Mission activities, up to a limit of 10 hours, as established during the accreditation phase.

The PhD scholarship is subject to the payment of INPS social security contributions to the state scheme for atypical workers in accordance with the regulations in force pursuant to Article 2, paragraph 26, of Law no. 335 of 8 August 1995, as amended, to the extent of two thirds to be paid by the administration and one third by the scholarship holder. PhD students are entitled to the protections and related rights.

Civil servants admitted to a Doctoral Course benefit, for the normal duration of the Course, from the leave provided for by collective bargaining or, if employees under public law, from extraordinary leave for study purposes, compatibly with the needs of the administration, pursuant to Article 2 of Law no. 476 of 13 August 1984, with or without allowances and unless explicitly waived, only if they are enrolled for the first time in a PhD Course, regardless of the disciplinary field. The right to the budget for the research activity carried out in Italy and abroad referred to in Article 9, paragraph 4, of Ministerial Decree 226/2021 remains unaffected.

The rules laid down as to the right to study referred to in Legislative Decree no. 68 of 29 March 2012 and Ministerial Decree no. 1320/2021 apply to doctoral students.

Without prejudice to the application of the rules for the protection of parenthood referred to in the decree of the Minister of Labour and Social Security of 12 July 2007, published in the Official Gazette of 23 October 2007, n. 247, doctoral students on parental leave retain the right to the awarded scholarship. At the end of the period of leave, the scholarship is paid upon resumption of course attendance up to the total duration of the scholarship itself.

PhD students are guaranteed representation on the Board of Professors of the doctorate concerning the treatment of didactic and organizational issues.

Art. 11

PhD Award

The title of Ph.D., abbreviated as "Dr. Ric." or "Ph.D.", is awarded conditional on the positive evaluation of a research thesis that contributes to the advancement of knowledge or methodologies in the chosen field of investigation. The doctoral thesis is written in Italian or English, or in another language, subject to the authorization of the Board of Professors and is accompanied by a summary, written in English.

The thesis, together with the report on the research activities carried out during the PhD Course and









on any publications, is examined by at least two evaluators appointed by the Board of Professors, external to the University that issues the doctoral degree and in possession of highly qualified experience, of which at least one is a University professor. These evaluators are professors (full and associate professors, emeritus professors, permanent and fixed-term researchers) or first researchers and research managers or similar highly qualified roles possibly attached to foreign institutions, unaffiliated to the University and to those who have contributed to the awarding of the doctoral degree or to the affiliated Universities including those with which there are co-supervision agreements. Evaluators may belong to foreign or international institutions.

The doctoral dissertation and defense of the thesis take place publicly before a commission, proposed by the Board of Professors and appointed by Rector's Decree, respecting, where possible, gender balance. The commission is composed according to the Regulations for the establishment and accreditation of campuses and courses for doctoral research.

Art. 12

The Administrator Responsible for the application of the procedure

Article 13

Processing of personal data and communications to candidates

The personal data requested from candidates are necessary for the purpose of participating in this competition and will be processed by the University in accordance with the principles set out in art. 5 of the Regulation, in the terms referred to in the information attached to this announcement (Annex no. 2). Pursuant to art. 6, par. 1, letter e) of the aforementioned Regulation, the processing is lawful, and the consent is implicit. All communications relating to this call procedure will be published solely on the official website of the University and will have the value of notification. No personal communication will be sent to the addresses indicated in the applications for participation.

<u>Right to Object to the Processing of Personal Data</u>: You may object at any time, on grounds relating to your particular situation, to specific processing activities, specifically:

- processing necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Data Controller (including profiling);
- processing necessary for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the Data Controller or by a third party (including profiling).

In such cases, the Data Controller must refrain from further processing your personal data unless there are compelling legitimate grounds for processing that override your interests, rights, and freedoms or for the establishment, exercise, or defense of legal claims. This same right is guaranteed if the data is processed for direct marketing purposes (right to object to processing pursuant to Article 21 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679).

<u>Right to Erasure of Personal Data</u>: You may request the Data Controller to erase your data if, subject to the exceptions of Article 17, paragraph 3:

- the personal data is no longer necessary in relation to the purposes for which it was collected or otherwise processed;
- you withdraw the consent on which the processing is based and there is no other legal ground for the processing;
- you object to the processing pursuant to Article 21, paragraph 1, of Regulation (EU) 2016/679, and there are no overriding legitimate grounds for the processing, or you object to the processing pursuant to Article 21, paragraph 2, of Regulation (EU) 2016/679;
- the personal data has been unlawfully processed (right to erasure pursuant to Article 17 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679);
- the personal data must be erased for compliance with a legal obligation under Union or Member State law to which the Data Controller is subject;
- the personal data has been collected in relation to the offer of information society services referred to in Article 8, paragraph 1, of the GDPR.

If you believe that our processing of your data has caused you harm or damage, or if you believe that there have been improper actions or unlawful processing of your personal data, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the Supervisory Authority, following the procedures established by the
